### **NEWS FROM THE TREASURER**

The following information from the Treasurer was inadvertently omitted from the February Flight Line. These policies were reviewed and agreed upon at the January board meeting and were added as an attachment to the current by-laws. As noted in the February Flight Line, these policies and procedures are already "known" and "done" but were never included in the club by-laws.

### MHRCS Fiscal Policies and Procedures Version 1.1, Jan 25, 2006

### Fiscal Responsibility:

 In that club funds are the net result of efforts and expenditures of each past and current member, it is the responsibility of the club membership and the Board of Directors to ensure wise use of club funds for current modeling activity and for expected and unexpected future uses to promote and maintain the activities of the club.

### **Budget Process:**

- The Board formulates a yearly budget based on last year's results, projected expenses for the upcoming year and expected number of members. The membership fee is then based on that budget/expected membership.
- The Club Membership approves the budget at a regular meeting.
- It is the goal of the club leadership that each year's budget be either balanced or have a surplus when possible. The club may exceed the budget for major expenditures with prior approval of the club membership (i.e. to develop, improve or acquire flying sites.)

### **Disbursement of Funds:**

- The authority to disburse club funds is a tiered process:
  - Step 1: The Club Membership approves a line item budget for the upcoming year.
  - Step 2: The Board of Directors can then approve spending of funds against that line item budget up to those amounts without further club approval.
  - Step 3: Board members or Directors may spend against their respective budgets without further approval, subject to a \$100 limit.
- Any non-budget item in excess of \$500 must have PRIOR approval by the Club Membership.

- Any expenditure by a club member must have prior Board Approval for any funds to be reimbursed.
- Any expenditure must be accompanied by a receipt for reimbursement.

### **Reporting Requirements:**

- The Treasurer shall report to the club at each regular meeting the current balances of each club account and the status of each budgeted line item. These reports are to be filed with the club secretary and are available to any club member for viewing during or after each meeting.
- Any club member may request to see the books of the club at any time.

# In Memory of Paul J. Bruno



As the editor of the MHRCS Newsletter for three years, the most difficult thing I had to do during my tenure was to announce to the Club the death of a fellow modeler. Well, it just got worse. One of the nicest guys I had ever met through modeling, Paul Bruno, has succumbed to cancer.

In September of 2005 he was starting to have pains in his arms, shoulders, and back. So much so that he finally went to the doctor to find out what was going on. Well, that was when the roof caved in. He was told he had lung, liver, and bone cancer throughout his body, and was given about a year to live. He and his family were devastated, as were guys like me, his other flying buddies, and his newfound friends at the DOT, where he had just started to work the year before.

He was so grateful for me helping him get that job, he mustered up the energy in October to drive up to my house from Valhalla and insisted on giving me two of his favorite models. I didn't know what to say, but he really wanted me to have them, so I accepted.

Well, six months after his diagnosis, he is gone, and this Club, and all of us in it, has lost a good friend and an excellent modeler. Paul was an exceptional builder and flyer, and the two models he gave me will hang in a place of honor in my new shop down here in Florida, and only be flown on very special occasions. I never knew Paul's age, it didn't matter, I surmise he was in his mid 40s, but he and I, and anyone else who had the privilege to know and fly with him, always had a grand time together at the field. He switched from glow to electrics a few years ago, I wonder why, and excelled in that field too. His passing has been one of the saddest times in my 45 years of modeling, only surpassed by the passing of my flying mentor years ago, Lou Morgan.



So the next time you look up into that beautiful blue sky, think of Paul, with his blue eyes and never ending smile, and say hi. He is most certainly in a better place, looking down on us and smiling as we fly our models for him.

# PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Let's start this month with news about the Hopewell Flying Field since enjoyment of flying model aircraft is what we are all about. Mr. Joseph Petrinella, owner of the Hopewell field, has informed us that the transfer of ownership of the field to Toll Bros Builders has been postponed from February to November. He has also informed us that we will have full access to the field for all this year for sure.

When questioned about the possibility of Toll Bros Builders already having building permits thru the Town and County building permit process as previously reported to us by one of the Town officials, Mr. Petrinella stated that he didn't see how this is possible as he is still the owner of the property and only the owner can petition the Town and County for building permits. This seems to tie together with the observations of a friend of the club who has access to the Town and county permit process and has not seen any activity in that regard.

The other force acting in our favor is the gradual cooling off of the housing market. According to the local Real Estate board, houses are on the market longer, interest rates are up and the number of new buyers is off somewhat. 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


### R/C Tip of the Month

You'll be able to safely beach your seaplane if you protect the bottoms of the pontoons with plastic strips cut from an empty plastic milk jug. Cut the corners form a gallon jug and glue them into place, as shown, with waterproof glue such as Zap-a-dap-a-Goo.
