Float Fly at Lake Taconic

C aturday started off badly for the intrepid pilots who trekked up to Lake Taconic. It was the May Float Fly so the weather as in previous years had to be bad.

Jerry, the organizer of the event, got lost. He ended up at the Northway before he realized that he had overshot the park exit.



I managed to get my Sikorsky off in the wind and choppy water conditions, but the flight was short lived. A few seconds after takeoff the plane wobbled and I found control difficult. Not knowing whether it was the wind or a control problem, I landed immediately and started to taxi back when the engine quit. After about fifteen minutes, the plane finally drifted back to shore and I found that the aileron push rod had come loose.

Things improved when Bill pulled off a nearly perfect flight, only to have his yellow bird's engine guit, forcing him to make deadstick landing, then row out to retrieve it using the park supplied rowboat. His second flight went well with some aerobatics thrown in and, after a perfect landing, taxiing back to shore. This was the

make a 'rowboat retrieval'. Lou had a similar experience with his electric.

weather, and wouldn't start. Further attempts to fly the electrics proved fruitless as the planes blew over onto their backs.

Jerry's speedboat had its share of problems. After many attempts, with engine only running in short bursts he finally gave up.

There was also a grandfatherly type there, with his two grandsons that watched the drama of the day's doings but just sat guietly.
